Dear Parents and Carers,

As Year 11 end their final full term at Poynton High School, I wanted to write to you with some important information. Year 11 have worked so incredibly hard this half term. It has been a challenging term for students, completing their second set of mock examinations and preparing for their final GCSE examinations. A massive well done to students for the effort and determination they have shown during this time. We were really pleased with how students performed in the mock exams that they have done.

As we enter their final weeks at Poynton High School, it is essential that students attend all lessons and work with us at all times so that they make the most of the opportunities. Please take time the read this bulletin which contains important information with regards to exams, revision and subject updates.

Revision and examination support

It is important that students use Easter to have some time off but to also focus on revision. The reward is the time off after the exams are finished when they can look back with pride on their hard work and preparation.

As a school we are committed to ensuring that you feel that you are well equipped in supporting your young person through their GCSEs. We have been working with students about effective revision looking at 'Preparation, Performance, Progress'. Students have looked at this during form time and in lessons. Thank you to all parents who attended our revision support evening this term so that you can support your young person with their revision. Our website contains lots of practical support for both yourself and your young person regarding revision techniques and strategies. We recommend that students should be doing a minimum of 3 hours of revision each day over the Easter break, taking rests in between, doing activities they enjoy and having one full day free from revision

Students can also find lots of resources and revision tips on the Year 11 Google Classroom and in their subject classrooms as well. You will also find subject specific revision advice in this bulletin. There is a Year 11 Study drop in session on a Tuesday in room 38 where students can come to do their own revision and homework. Miss Dovey will be there to support them with their revision. This will run 3:25-4:15pm. Also running on a Tuesday in room 33, is a Year 11 Welfare drop in session where students can drop in to speak to Miss Hollingworth is they have any welfare concerns. This will run 3:15-3:45pm.

All students will receive the summer examination timetable before Easter.

<u>Maths</u>

Students have now received the grades and feedback from their February mocks and revision is now fully underway to best prepare them for their summer exams. In the summer students will sit three maths papers, two calculator and one non-calculator, which are all 1 hour and 30 minutes long. They will sit their first paper, the non-calculator exam, on Thursday 16th May, and the first of the two calculator papers on Monday 3rd June.

It is very important that students have access to all the equipment they may need to complete the exam, so please ensure that your young person has access to the following:

- Black or Blue Pen
- Pencil
- Ruler that measures up to 30cm
- Protractor
- Pair of Compasses

It is important that students familiarise themselves with how to use their exam calculator, so it is best to purchase one of these as soon as possible if needed.

In lessons, we are helping students to prepare by running walking talking mocks once per fortnight which are designed to show students how to best show their working and answer examstyle questions. Students will also be completing a past paper once per fortnight in lesson time, so that they have lots of exposure to the types of questions they could expect to see in May and have chance to practice their exam technique. This month in the maths department we have been celebrating maths month, which has included celebrating Pi Day, all month we have been running competitions for students in year 11 based on their engagement in revision on Dr Frost, with prizes for the top participators to be announces very soon!

Assessments

Students have completed their Paper 2 mock exams and have spent time in lessons going through and evaluating these exams. Lots of students have improved on the Paper 2 mocks compared to the paper 1 mocks, so well done to those students!

Students will have received follow-up tasks to complete to help them identify and work on any areas they did not perform well on in the Paper 2 mocks. It is essential these are completed to ensure they are improving on those specific areas of focus

Revision Resources

All students will be given tasks to complete for Seach Science to help structure their revision. These will be given out before the Easter holidays for students to complete over Easter and will continue up until their GCSE exams start.

<u>History</u>

Year 11 have begun revision sessions in class now that they have finished the final unit on the Reigns of King Richard and King John. Students should now be completing revision at home as well, there is plenty of material to help with this, exercise books cover all the topics needed to complete the exam papers, revision guides on our units can be useful and websites like Seneca Learning and BBC Bitesize can also be an excellent revision tool. All Year 11 students have been invited to join the History Revision Google Classroom page, there students will find past papers, quizzes and revision clocks on all papers, and other revision material. There are also checklists of the topics you will need to know for the exams. Finally, students should be reminded that there are revision classes on the American West run by the History department on Tuesdays and Wednesdays after school and they should sign up for these classes if they wish to attend.

Geography

The Year 11 geographers have had a super busy half term. They have all now completed their human geography fieldwork on the 2 dry days that we had in March and were a credit to themselves and the school as they collected their data in Poynton Village and then wrote up the data in the hall led by Miss Holyland. They are now focused on completing units on the Living World and Resource Management as well as another session in the Hall to follow up on work from the physical fieldwork days that we completed right at the end of the summer term of year 10.

As soon as we come back from the Easter school break, Year 11 will be studying the pre-release issue evaluation topic for their Geographical Skills paper which arrived in school just before the holiday. There will be some tasks set on this on Google Classroom for all students to look at whatever the topic might be and to complete before we study it in depth next term in class.

Revision is ongoing as we approach the practice stage of the year, using their exercise books, revision guides and flash cards and well as the past papers and their mark schemes that are on all students Google Classroom pages. We strongly advise students to use the strategies to revise effectively that have been covered in school.

Well done to Year 11 students for their work this half-term! Year 11 have now finished the German and Spanish course and can now concentrate on revision.

There was a lot of improvement in the Listening skills from the scores in the most recent mocks! Well done Y11!


Revision and exams:

After the Easter holidays, Y11 will sit the first part of their French and Spanish exams. The **Speaking** exams which account for 25% of the final grade will take place between **Monday 29th April and Tuesday 7th May**. Each teacher will give their classes the exact days and times for the Speaking exams. This is an official exam and we will appreciate parental support in ensuring students are in school, on time.


Over the Easter holidays, students should be concentrating on practising for their Speaking exam. There are past papers available in the department and staff have put some on Google Classroom. Little and often works well for languages, so 15-20 min a few times a week works better than a long revision session. A <u>parent's guide to MFL</u> is available on the school website. It contains some handy tips for revision in languages.

GCSE Business

Our Year 11 classes have come to the end of their final unit, finishing the course with External Influences on business. We've been lucky enough to work with Just Ice again. We also had the chance to visit the café to see their work in action, and sample the goods!

Students should use the Easter break to focus on their revision. They have a booklet which sets out their weekly revision tasks. They should use this in conjunction with their revision guide, BBC Bitesize and Seneca.

For those students who are pushing for the top grades, we would strongly recommend the Tutor2U exam board specific sessions on YouTube. These can be accessed through Google Classroom.

Enterprise and Marketing

Our Year 11 class have celebrated their results of their R068 coursework. They worked extremely hard to produce convincing pitches to present their designs. We were really impressed with the professional standard of the pitches. Students are now finishing their R069 assignments ready to send to the exam board on 1st May.

Students should use the Easter holidays to revise for R067. They should use their revision guide, the bank of online resources as well as the revision booklets given to them in class to focus their revision. They can also access a range of past papers on the OCR website and use their registration to Boost Learning to access revision materials and complete exam board approved revision quizzes.

Computer Science

Year 11 Computer Science students have been undertaking a recap of Systems Architecture, going over concepts discussed last year but this time going into more depth. Topics have included, architecture of the CPU, factors affecting CPU performance, memory (primary storage) and storage (secondary storage).

Following the completion of this, the students will also revisit algorithms, specifically searching and sorting algorithms. There will be a focus on exam questions in this area, giving the students the opportunity to practice being presented with a problem that they are to design an algorithm to solve. There will be a focus on using both a high-level programming language (Python) that the students have been studying since Year 10, and the exam board's own version of Pseudocode, known as Exam Reference Language, which will be used to write their algorithms in.

Year 11 students are now preparing for their upcoming examinations. They are working through the topic lists that can be found on Google Classroom. They have been given revision booklets and should be using these alongside all the resources they have been signposted to on Google Classroom. Revision sessions are held after school for Year 11 students in rm 36 on Wednesdays.

CNAT iMedia

Year 11 students are busy finishing off their Interactive Multimedia Presentations. This unit of work will be completed by Easter, allowing plenty of time to prepare for the examination unit R093. They have been given revision booklets and purchased revision guides and should be using these alongside all the resources they have been signposted to on Google Classroom As students are no longer allowed to work on their coursework at home, we encourage both Year 10 and Year 11 students to attend drop in sessions at lunchtime in Room 28, if they are behind. There are also sessions after school Wednesdays in Rm 29 and Thursdays in rm 28. Suggestions for further wider learning that students can do over Easter, include watching films such as The Matrix, The Imitation Game, Hackers Pirates of Silicon Valley and The Social Network. The National Video Game Museum in Sheffield is worth a visit. Visitors can discover, play and create videogames through the different activities that they offer.

Product Design

Students have been continuing with their NEA with the deadline of Thursday 28th March 2024. The way in which the Year 11 Product Design students have conducted themselves throughout their NEA has been fantastic and they have all worked so incredibly hard to reach the deadline. Although the deadline is the 28th March, if students need to work on additional elements over the holiday they can as long as it is submitted to Google Classroom by **Monday 15th April at 9am** as it is being marked on the inset day.

Next half term, the sole focus will be revision. We will revisit topics as well as do past papers so that students feel equipped for their exam in June.

Students have now been issued their revision workbooks and they also have their revision folders that they can take home to use as part of their revision.

Tasks will be set in lesson with revision homework's being set for students.

CNAT Sports Studies

Students are working on the exam unit content in all lessons. This is the final unit that students will complete to make up their final grade for CNAT Sport. They will sit this exam on 13th May.

There will be a study hour every Tuesday after school in Room 7 that students can take advantage of to support their theory knowledge and exam technique in preparation for this

GCSE PE

Students have been working hard and the Non-Examined Assessment part of the course has now been submitted to OCR for moderation. Provisional scores have been given to students, but these are subject to moderation from the exam board.

Students have covered all the content for both Paper 1 and Paper 2 and will now be focusing on revision and exam technique in lessons. We have begun this through do a 'Walking talking' style mock exam to support exam technique.

Student homework has been set around exam style questions and creating revision material to show their teacher.

Students have worked well in their theory lessons and this must be supported through their own work and revision during their own time.

GCSE PE Paper 1 exam is on Wednesday 22nd May and Paper 2 exam is on Monday 3rd June

<u>Drama</u>

Students have all **Component 1 (Devising Theatre 40%)**. This has included designing for / performing in a devised piece of theatre, meeting the home-learning deadline for portfolio/creative log and also completing an *evaluation* of their work. Many of them have risen admirably to this challenge and are rightly proud of the work they have done, in many cases the quality of work has exceeded GCSE standard.

Students have now also designed for/ performed in their **Component 2 (Performance from a Text 20%).** An external examiner, friends, parents younger drama students attended. It was a fantastic two night celebration of their efforts.

Lessons next term will focus on exam technique and revising knowledge and ideas for the written exam *Component 3 (Interpreting theatre).* Students should seek to supplement this classwork with repeated practice exam questions at home.

Dance

It is the Year 11 Practical Exam Day on the 28th March and our showcase that evening 6.00pm in the Hall. Tickets can be bought through Evolve or you can pay on the door, £5. They have been working extremely hard to create their pieces and the evening will be a celebration of their work. Over Easter they should be using the Revision Guide given to practice 12 mark questions using guidance in the guide. When they return they will have no practical and they will finish the last professional work they study.

<u>Music</u>

This term our Music students have been working on their Ensemble performances. They must record themselves performing with other musicians showing their knowledge and understanding of ensemble skills. This is much more difficult than recording their solo performance as they must be organised and disciplined about attending group rehearsals. The Easter Holiday is crucial time for extra independent rehearsal on their part ready for recording the final performance of the course when we return to school. Once this unit is out of the way they can then focus on the composition and listening units. The next deadline with be to hand in their two compositions. Once this is complete we can then purely focus on the listening section more for every single lesson.

The Google Classroom Music Department now has a revision topic. The revision resources have always been in the music google drive but the school would like a consistent place for resources and this is now where it is stored. There are plenty resources - audio for set studies, analysis, exam questions, revision videos, revision posters chunked down and revision summary on each set study

including a glossary of AQA keywords. Please encourage your son or daughter to revise over the holiday including listening to the set study repeatedly as well as the home learning set on Thursday.

Our Senior Choir has been a great success for many years and this year is no exception. Over 60 members performed at Congleton Town Hall on 20th March at the Cheshire East Secondary school Choirs Music Showcase. They also performed in a school concert this term. The students sang a wide range of songs in 4-part harmony.
